






JURASSIC WORLD R E B I R T H

new Jurassic movie that was released earlied July, "Jurassic" orld: Rebirth", was promised to revive the franchise with a "back-to-basics" dinosaur survival story. However, the movie we got instead feels like a safe, CGI-heavy blockbuster that disrespects the older generation of the franchise and divides audiences rather than unites them.

The film takes place three years after dinosaurs were pushed out of the majority of the Earth and are now found only in isolated tropical areas. The main character, Zora Bennett, is sent on a risky mission to gather DNA from three huge species—one in the water, one on land, and one in the air—in the hope that it could help cure heart disease. However, during the assignment, her crew encounters a trapped family whose boat has been assaulted by aquatic dinosaurs, and both groups are compelled to work together to unearth nefarious corporate secrets.

The premise seems fantastic, but there is some controversy. Fans expecting the slow-burning tension of the original Jurassic Park will be disappointed: the picture gets right into noisy, quick action scenes featuring computer-generated dinosaurs that some believe are too phony to be terrifying. The continual CGI extravaganza provides little room for the tense and quiet moments that made the first film so unforgettable.

Although the scientist character has been applauded for providing LGBTQ+ representation in the series, critics believe the position is underwritten. Rupert Friend's role as the antagonist, an influential pharmaceutical executive, comes across as cartoonishly wicked rather than a credible menace. The film raises intriguing concerns about utilizing science for business, but never delves further into them, making the storyline feel empty.

In conclusion, if you're looking for a showy summer movie with dinosaurs chasing people, you might love Rebirth. However, if you're expecting a return to the wonder, realism, and dread that made the original film renowned, you may be disappointed.



Recently, live-action remakes of animated classics have been facing a lot of criticism for many reasons. These movies often fail because they take away the charm and expressiveness that animation can offer and occasionally deviate from the source material, removing the essence of the source material. 
HOW TO TRAIN YOUR TO REAL STATES TO THE Redemption of Live-Action Remake film

a magical adventure that will make you wish you were actually there, hogwarts legacy is an immersive, story-rich, open-world action RPG where you play as a witch or wizard roaming the wizarding world. Set 100 years before the events of the harry potter saga, in a unique 1800s setting, the game allows you to explore freely in any order across 14 distinctive regions. I've racked up about 25 hours of gameplay and have only reached around 40% of the main storyline, so there's plenty of content for anyone worried about running out of things to do.

SETTING

the wizarding world in hogwarts legacy is built on j.k. rowling's harry potter universe. the visuals are stunning—I often find myself stopping to admire the immersive scenery. fans of the books or movies will recognize landmarks such as the grand staircase, hogsmeade, and the forbidden forest.



the developers paid incredible attention to detail, and you may even discover easter eggs referencing the original harry potter stories. players can also encounter magical creatures like phoenixes, hippogriffs, and thestrals, the world can be explored on foot, via broomstick, using the floo network, or my favorite—riding a hippogriff.

In hogwarts legacy, you play as a fifth-year student recommended by your mentor, professor eleazar fig, who teaches magical theory at hogwarts, the player possesses a rare ability to harness ancient magic, making them a target for dark elves seeking this power, rankok, the main antagonist, is introduced early in the story and seeks to control all ancient magic to violently settle the longstanding conflict between elves and wizards.

GAMEPLAY

the gameplay is one of the most engaging aspects of hogwarts legacy. as the story progresses, players learn a wide variety of spells—some for combat, some for convenience, and some just for fun. main quests involve exploration, infiltration, or attending classes, while side quests often reward players with new spells such as the three forbidden spells, transformation, wingardium leviosa, and arresto momentum. players are free to explore anywhere, encountering magical creatures along the way, many of which can be captured in your knapsack and later released into a large personal terrarium.

CONCLUSION





Perfect Recipe

Craving freshly home-baked
cookies? We often crave a
single piece but who has
the energy to bake an
entire batch? Don't worry,

Why spend hours baking
when all you want is a snack?
"Especially for those stuck in a
condo that lacks space for an oven,
or worse, no kitchen at all. No oven,
"no worries! In just 5 minutes, you can
achieve the gooey, soft, chewy
cookie that will blow your mind!

After a bunch of recipe hunts for "Microwave Cookie Mug" since I was 10, honestly all I can say is all the recipes were... well, disappointing. So I crumpled this hack into the bin. But one day, 7 years later, while I was craving home-baked cookies, I decided to trust the process. Turns out, I couldn't have asked for anything better:

The Perfect No Oven Cookie Mug Recipe. Thank me later!

Recipe

2 tbsp of melted butter 1 tbsp of white sugar 2 tbsp of white brown (mix)

1 tbsp of milk 1/2 tsp of vanilla extract (mix)

1/4 cup + 2 tbsp all purpose flour 1/4 tsp of baking soda 1/8 tsp of salt (mix)

Desired amount of chocolate chips Microwave for 45 seconds on medium heat (varies on the microwave)





Imagine collapsing in the middle of a crowded hallway —only to watch dozens of eyes glance at you and then walk away. No one moves. This chilling silence is the essence of the bystander effect, a social psychological theory that states that individuals are less likely to offer help to a victim in the presence of other people, as they feel less obligated to act, often assuming someone else will help instead.

An experiment was conducted by two grade 10 students, Poonnada and Preechaya, to test how different population densities differ in terms of helping in emergency situations. They visited three locations—a low-density market, an average-density walking street, and a high-density mall—and in each place, one person would "accidentally" drop a test object, a flower bouquet, claw clip, or dummy phone, while another timed how long it took for a bystander to assist.

In the market, help came almost instantly, with the bouquet picked up in just two seconds. On the walking street, it took 19 seconds for someone to return the claw clip, while in the busy mall, it took a full three minutes before the dropped phone was picked up. The results showed that people were far more likely to help quickly in less crowded places, supporting the idea that in large groups, individuals feel less personal responsibility to act.

This experiment clearly shows that the bystander effect makes people expect others to step in. Knowing this helps us realize the importance of taking responsibility and learning to overcome apathy and instead act with empathy, helping others no matter the situation.

Color is a crucial part of our life—influencing how we feel, helping us to express ourselves, and even affecting our perception of the world. However, do we all see colors the same way? To explore this question, a Google survey form about color—divided into three sections—specifically color knowledge, emotions, and personal connections—was made.

This survey has gathered 28 responses from anonymous online participants. This was not a graded test, but a relaxing survey to reflect about our perception and personality through color!



In the first section, the information that was gathered was about personal information of the participants and their color knowledge. Most participants were 16-17 years old, and a few of the participants appeared to be younger or as old as 67 years old. Around 10% of the participants reported to be color blind, mainly red-green. In the knowledge questions, almost 96% of the participants correctly identified that mixing red and green creates brown, and 76.9% of the participants selected red, blue, and yellow as primary colors. Furthermore, the result of the infamous "blue/black vs gold/white dress," surprisingly has split responses almost evenly, showing how lightning affects color perception.



The second section was about our mood and preferences when it comes to color. This section aimed to make participants share how they feel with the various color palettes given. There were three main observations that were recorded. Dark-moody tones made about 78% of participants feel mysterious or dramatic, while soft or pastel tones gave a sense of calmness or romance, where over 57% of the participants agreed. Finally, bright and warm linked to palettes were nostalgia happiness. When it comes to aesthetic preferences, there were nearly evenly split between serene-minimal looks and boldadventurous styles, featuring how personal taste evenly balanced our visual world.

Overall, the feedback on the survey was both positive and creative, with one participant remarking that colors "make life more human" by helping us express emotions.

This survey wasn't about testing knowledge—it's about exploring how students see, and feel about colors. It shows that color is more than art—it's part of identity, culture, and creativity through science and psychology. We hope it inspires conversations about how people see the world differently—fulfilling the world with colors again.



MATH

- Improve fundamental math skills, such as arithmetics, usage of coefficients, meaning of intercepts in linear functions, and etc. being able to recognize and rearrange them is essential
- Understand what functions really are, starting with linear and progressing towards quadratics, focusing on their relationship with what it means
- Memorize basic formulas like the area of a circle and the sphere's and cone's surface area and volume
- For word problems, think about what function it is expecting us to use, whether it's asking for linear, quadratic, or exponential functions

ENGLISH

- Allocate less time for easier questions and more for harder questions - vocab, grammar, and notes sections should take less than a minute each so you get more time for the reading sections
- Read only what is necessary skip reading the questions for vocab and grammar, and read only the question for notes
- Try to improve on standard English conventions as it's the easiest to improve
- Do the vocab, skipping immediately if unsure, then do standard English conventions, then come back to the long reading sections
- Not finishing all the questions is normal, so emphasize on finishing all the conventions and leave the rest to fate
- Use sources like bluebook practice tests, YouTube (especially for explaining conventions and shortcuts), and go watch any English SAT sections breakdown video
- While practicing, look at mistakes and analyzing why it's wrong and understanding the questions' design
- Use ChatGPT to explain answers if it's still unclear, but don't use it for answers. They do make mistakes when giving answers but it's fine for reexplanation
- Use one prep (SAT question bank but more organized) and other extraneous websites for free practice tests, albeit make sure it is similar to questions given by the College Board
- Go watch channels like Setelle Tutoring and copy their methodology
- Spam Merriam Webster vocabulary quiz for wellvocabulary

- Utilize Desmos only when necessary, some problems are actually faster without Desmos
- Be able to use Desmos to its fullest, especially on questions that requires long calculations but can be simplified with Desmos
- Every information they give is usually necessary, unlike the English part so if it's not all used then check again

- Be proficient in algebra be able to reorganize variables and constants within logarithmic functions, exponential, and polynomials
- In complex word problems, write or draw each of the component of the question e.g. write out a question on nested percentages or draw it for understanding
- Substitute values that you can in multivariable questions - helps reduce amount of variables and makes easier to solve
- In hard geometry problems, notice common characteristics like the radius of the circle or proportionality between multiple triangles as they're usually the key to solving these problems

- Don't fall for the "choose the best answer" propaganda, there is always only one correct logical answer, if you can't find it then you've missed some key ideas. Don't "assume", the answer is there (somewhere)
- Use same sources as <700, although if you're really desperate, learning from a tutor has its benefits and has worked for some
- Practice reading from original speeches, books, or poems that have esoteric terms pertaining to those distinct passages.
- When reading, try to read only once to get the main idea, rereading takes too much time.
- Expect unreadable texts: passages which have more vocabulary than the actual vocab section and more incomprehensible diction than a standrad scientific journal, so read the words that you do know and surmise the correlation between events


